National Institution for Youth Education

The National Institution for Youth Education (NYC), an independent administrative institution, is an educational institution established to promote the healthy development of young people and youth education in Japan. NYC's activities include the organization of various training courses for young people and persons related to youth education, the promotion of cooperation and links between institutions and groups connected to youth education, and provision of grants to groups engaged in youth education.

National Taisetsu Youth Friendship Center

The facility is located within Daisetsuzan National Park in a nature-rich environment surrounded by imposing mountains and primeval forests.

The facility takes advantage of local characteristics to offer the nature of four seasons and training programs such as mountain climbing and hiking, along with a cross-country skiing course in the winter.

Support Activities For User Groups

In order to promote the various and actively held study activities for youth educational leaders, youth educators and youths, the center provides opportunities for various training, exchange and experiential activities as well as consultation services for those who seek assistance on how to utilize the facility.

Examples

- Leadership trainings and programs for qualification grant for youth organizations
- Pre and post activities of international exchange programs for youth organizations
- Youth volunteer symposiums as well as outdoor field activities
- New student and business orientations
- Club activities and sports/cultural activities for high school and college student

Organizations, which can utilize the facilities

Youth organizations: Youth organizations & groups, youth educational instructors, schools, etc.

Other groups: Adult groups, nonprofit organizations, private companies, government agencies, etc.

Period for application

From last October to one month prior to the first day of use.

Rates

(1) Facility use: Free

*Groups for general use: 800 yen per stay per person

*Lectur's Rooms use: 1,200 yen per stay per person

(2) Washing fee (bed linens, etc., per set): 200 yen

(3) Meal price: approx. 1, 680 yen for three meals

*For youths in junior high school or higher levels who eat breakfast, lunch and dinner at the restaurant.

*Meal prices depend on the age.
